#### EQUITY, DIVERSITY, INCLUSION AND ANTI-RACISM POLICY



#### DEAR FRIENDS,

A Noise Within's 2022/23 season saw both new patrons and long-time subscribers feeling greater comfort coming back to the theatre post-pandemic.

We opened the season with George Orwell's Animal Farm. The production was lauded by critics and patrons alike and received a number of





Los Angeles Drama Critic's Circle Awards, including Best Ensemble, Best Production, and Best Direction. Next up was August Wilson's *Radio Golf* which continued our commitment to his entire 10-play American Century Cycle. The production was a tremendous success, enjoying both large and diverse audiences.

Of course, it would not be A Noise Within without our annual offering of A Christmas Carol. This was our 10th year presenting the award-winning production of Dickens' greatest classic. It was enjoyed by both young families coming for the first time and long-time patrons who return year after year.

The spring opened with Shakespeare's beloved comedy *Much Ado About Nothing*. This production garnered rave reviews and a number of awards. The run also included nine student matinees packed with young people from all over Southern California, many seeing a live performance for the first time. Following *Much Ado About Nothing*, Manuel Puig's searing and timely, *Kiss of the Spider Woman*. Reviewers and audiences found themselves mesmerized by this powerful, two-person play. It too received numerous awards and critic's choices.

And finally, wrapping up the season, Lauren Gunderson's love letter to Shakespeare, *The Book of Will*. The play celebrates both the Bard, and the power of a resident company of artists, something we deeply believe in—and have been committed to since A Noise Within's inception.

Our community outreach program Noise Now was very active with eight separate events, including an inspiring performance by The Trans Chorus of Los Angeles and full houses for *Latina Christmas Special*, our second year presenting the Off-Broadway hit.



We offer show tickets at a reduced cost, matinees designed specifically for student audiences, post-show conversations with the artists, and free study guides for our plays. In addition to that, Education increases access to the arts for schools that cannot provide these resources themselves, through our in-class workshops and after-school residencies. When costs are prohibitive for schools, our arts educators are able to provide at a time when students, parents, and teachers need us most. As always, our programs served a majority low-income schools.

Noise Now is an enhanced commitment to being of service to all audiences, an opportunity to expand our family by engaging with our neighboring communities and peer organizations, and an initiative for building stronger relationships as we demonstrate our eagerness to listen well and respond courageously. Through these collaborative interdisciplinary partnerships, we strive to celebrate underrepresented populations, communities of color, young people, and all others not equitably represented in the theatre. Our stages have always been a space for healing, and connecting over universal human stories has never been more necessary.

#### **FEATURED PARTNERS:**

THE DANCE AND THE **RAILROAD** Presented by Artists at Play, this was a haunting and powerfully affecting work by David Henry Hwang, revolving around two Chinese artists and their fellow railroad workers, who stage a strike to protest the inhuman conditions suffered by the Chinese laborers in the American West of 1867.

**UNMASKED** Inspired by visual images of the diversity of Los Angeles County, TheatreWorkers Project collaborated with formerly incarcerated and justiceimpacted members of Cal State LA's Project Rebound community to develop an original theatre piece based on the participants' poetry and prose.

CYCLE OF POVERTY Lower Depth Theatre proudly presented their Cycle of Poverty Reading Festival over two days. This festival was the culmination of their new Commission Fellowship Program and gave their 2022 cohort the opportunity to showcase the four new full-length plays they developed under the program. Each of the plays explored the social and racial issues within the cycle of poverty through BIPOC perspectives. Playwright fellows included: Vasanti Saxena, Sage Martin, DeLane McDuffie, and Marlow Wyatt.

The Commission Fellowship Program supports the development of new plays by BIPOC and/or women-identifying playwrights by providing development and financial support to emerging playwrights.

# EQUITY, DIVERSITY, INCLUSION, AND ANTI-RACISM

ANW is committed to the lifelong work of Equity, Diversity, Inclusion, and Anti-Racism (EDIA), which includes an ongoing analysis of how we work, what we put onstage, and the way audiences experience our theatre. Over the past few seasons, we've taken several steps towards advancing these core institutional priorities. Our 2022-23 initiatives included bi-weekly staff meetings to discuss the systemic changes we'd like to see implemented throughout every level of the organization; a vastly expanded approach to community-representative marketing and engagement; the implementation of an EDIA Onboarding video for our volunteer ushers; and the continued, intentional expansion of our Staff, Board, and Resident Artist Company.

Some of our EDIA work in the 2022-23 season included:

ANW employed 150 actors, understudies, stage managers, directors, and designers and 56% of these artists were BIPOC.

83% of our stage directors were BIPOC.

The Board of Directors consisted of 11 women and 9 men and 35% were BIPOC.

Our audience was made up of 22% BIPOC patrons.
